Harassment prevention programs offered

Two local, women-owned businesses, Global Training Alliance in Palm Desert and Management Dynamics Inc. in Palm Springs, are jointly presenting a program that meets employers' new training requirements on preventing sexual harassment.

In California, AB 1825 takes effect on Jan. 1 and requires employers with 50 or more workers to provide their supervisors with two hours of sexual harassment prevention training within one year of the bill's effective date and every two years thereafter.

Palm Springs

Groundbreaking set for subdivision

Ground is slated to be broken Jan. 4 on Alta, a new subdivision of upscale homes to be built at South Palm Canyon Drive and Bogert Trail. Sales director Nick Dibari said actual construction is likely to begin by late January or early February.
